

- Ted Mick resigned from the Benzie County Road Commission. The Benzie County Board of Commissioners held a special meeting to interview applicants. We appointed Paul Beechraft to fill the remainder of his term. Paul Beechraft stated that he would resign as Inland Township supervisor as there is a conflict of interest with those positions.
- With the passage of the county wide school and youth resource officer millage, we decided to move both officers to under the Benzie County Sheriff's office.
- Updated the proposed budget to reflect the passing of the millage. As it stands, the jail will be fully funded by it's millage. The first time in a very long time.
- The Animal control officer informed us that the hot water is out in the animal shelter, it might already have been fixed. Also, they have lots of kittens and cats available for adoption.
- Two rooftop AC units are in need of repair or replacement. We approved the repair of one and are requiring competitive bids for the replacement of the other.
- ARPA – The county had a survey out asking the public on how they think the county should spend the county's ARPA funds. The survey listed 10 items and asked people to rank them. As of the last BOC meeting the top 3 are Affordable Housing, Broadband and Child care.
- I have been asked to sit on an Ad-Hoc Broadband committee from the Benzie Economic Development and Brownfield Redevelopment Authority. This committee is tasked with suggesting the counties next steps in broadband development. We had our first meeting last week and are working out the goals and objectives for the project manager, Mark Shapiro, that was hired.
 - Eclipse Communications, Cherry Capital and Peninsula Fiber Network have established a consortium. This will better equip each entity to acquire grants and help pricing the service on a competitive level.
 - Charter/Spectrum has completed most of the northern Benzie county RDOF census blocks and will be starting on the southern end of Homestead Twp in late October or November.
